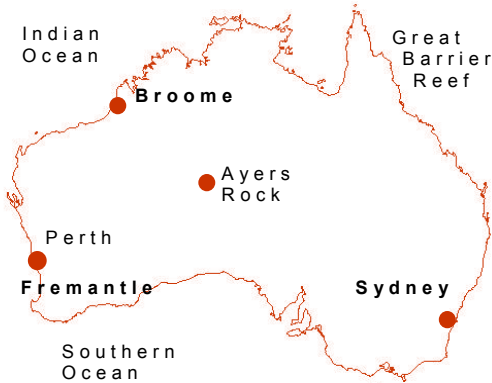


A STUDY ABROAD EXCHANGE PROGRAM

BROOME

Study in Broome in the Kimberley region of North Western Australia, an environment full of Aboriginal culture and history. Broome is a small campus, offering units in Aboriginal Studies, Nursing and Education.

FREMANTLE

Situated at the heart of this vibrant port city, the Notre Dame campus is an ideal location for both study and recreation. The Fremantle campus offers a wide range of disciplines at the largest of the three campuses.

SYDNEY

The Sydney campus has two sites with convenient access to city life. The two campuses are comprised of the University’s Schools of Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Law, Philosophy and Theology as well as Medicine and Nursing.



STUDENT LIFE

Students are encouraged to participate in all aspects of university life, including sporting, recreational, cultural, and social activities.

Fall: August-December (Semester 2)

HIGHLIGHTED COURSE FIELD TRIPS (Freemantle)

Australian History & Society: Explore the Australian outback, meet members of a local Aboriginal community and learn about their culture on a trip to the Kimberley region.

Business in Asia: Experience Asian culture and business methods on location. Organizations visited in the past have included stockbroking, industrial and construction firms.

Environmental Ecology & History of the South Coast: After lecture time on campus, spend eleven days sailing around the Western Australian coastline on board the ST Leeuwin II—a three-masted tall sailing ship.

HOUSING & MEALS

Students generally live on campus in a furnished single or shared room with computer facilities. Kitchen facilities are provided for self-catering. Coin-operated laundry machines are available.

PASSPORTS & VISAS

All students must have a valid passport to study in Australia and it should be valid six months beyond their stay. In addition, US students must obtain a visa before arriving in Australia. More information will be provided by the Gonzaga University Study Abroad Office.



PROGRAM COST

Gonzaga University tuition + Notre Dame room and board charges. Airfare and textbooks are not included.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Fall 2012 / Spring 2013: **February 1, 2012**

Early application is encouraged. Incomplete applications will not be considered until all documents have been received.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The University of Notre Dame Exchange program is open to all undergraduates who have completed sophomore year by the time they study abroad. Admission to the program is based on the following criteria:

- 3.0 GPA
- Two letters of academic recommendation
- Clearance forms
