## Teacher Education Study Abroad in Zambia Summer 2010

- ◆ A unique opportunity to work with and for the people of Zambia
- ◆ An amazing learning experience that creates an extraordinary lifetime memory





The Society of Jesus (Jesuits) has long engaged in International Ministry; in particular, the Oregon Province has had a long history of working in Zambia. The Jesuits own and run, in partnership with the local community, the Charles Lwanga College of Education, located in the southern part of Zambia. The College offers three diploma programs that train K-12 teachers in the traditions of the Catholic Church and Jesuit Pedagogy.

Some 95% of primary school age children are enrolled at schools with 20% continuing to secondary level and 2% of the 20 - 24 age group in tertiary level. Illiteracy is only 27% but the drop out rate at schools is very high. In rural areas, the standard of education is hampered by lack of facilities, transport and teachers.

Gonzaga University's Department of Teacher Education, in partnership with Charles Lwanga College, is offering a study abroad experience during the summer of 2010. You can earn 4 credits toward the teacher certification program:



- 3 credits of coursework (EDTE 231 – Elementary Program; EDTE 418 – Secondary Program)
- 1 credit of Teacher certification field experience

The experience will take place over the course of four weeks. Prior to the four week experience, you will participate in a number of pre-immersion seminars during the spring term of 2010.

Three weeks will include coursework and field-work. The 4<sup>th</sup> week is dedicated to touring areas of Zambia and enhancing your personal experience.



## Teacher Education Program

### Course Goals & Objectives

- ◆ Learn about the culture of Zambia
- ◆ Interact with Zambian teachers, K-12 students, and pre-service teachers from the Charles Lwanga College of Education
- ◆ Create learning opportunities that are developmentally appropriate and specific to the needs of all learners in the classroom
- ◆ Develop content area instruction/assessment integrating language arts, music, and drama



Zambia is a country in the southern part of Africa. It is home to beautiful landscapes, game reserves and Victoria Falls, which is one of the largest falls in the world.



Quiet beauty, bustle, abounding life and brimming joy characterize many aspects of music and dance and art in Zambia.

You will live, study, and work on the Charles



Lwanga campus. Your accommodations and meals will be simple fare. Your fieldwork will include time teaching and/or observing in schools in the rural southern area of Zambia, as well as at the local Jesuit-run high school (Canisius High School).

- ◇ \$25 non-refundable application fee payable to Gonzaga University
