HOUSING AND MEALS

Students live in Erasmus dorms, student apartments or homestays offered by the university.

PROGRAM COST

Gonzaga University tuition + Erasmus room & board charges. Airfare and textbooks are not included.

PASSPORT AND VISAS

All students must have a valid passport to study in the Netherlands and it must be valid three months beyond their stay in Europe. In addition, US students staying in the Netherlands for a period longer than 3 months have to obtain a Residency Permit (VTV: Vergunning tot Verblijf). More information will be provided by the Gonzaga University Study Abroad Office.



APPLICATION DEADLINE

Fall 2009: **March 1, 2009**

Spring 2010: **September 1, 2009**

Early application is encouraged. Incomplete applications will not be considered until all documents have been received.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The Erasmus Exchange program is open to all undergraduates who have completed sophomore year by the time they study abroad. All courses are taught in English. Admission to the program is based on the following criteria:

- ◆ 3.0 GPA
- ◆ Two letters of academic recommendation
- ◆ Clearance forms

4. Two academic recommendations
5. \$50 non-refundable application fee payable to Gonzaga Univ.
6. Completed applications will be accepted at the Study Abroad Office, 323 East Boone Avenue.
