COURSE DESCRIPTION

In this course students will develop the basic language skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking in order to communicate successfully in Italian.

In addition there will be a focus on achieving “cultural competency”, by studying such topics as Italian geography, the Italian school system and the Italian family. Each unit in the textbook pairs themes of Italian culture with essential points of grammar and vocabulary.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Basic communication skills in daily situations:

- Asking for and giving basic information.
- Expressing personal needs, likes and dislikes.
- Expressing past actions.
- Comprehension of short dialogues and simple conversations.
- To be able to read and comprehend basic written texts.
- To be able to construct basic texts in the form of e-mails, letters and description of daily life.

REQUIREMENTS

Course requirements include four quizzes, one Mid-Term and a Final Exam.

Regular attendance, completion of all homework assignments and active class participation are essential.
