## Hoop it Up: Gonzaga's Basketball Heritage



For the first time, Gonzaga University Archives and Gonzaga Athletics have teamed up to offer the public a free exhibit called "Hoop It Up: Gonzaga's Basketball Heritage." The exhibit, which includes items dating from 1906 to the present, is on display in the Cowles Rare Book Reading Room in Gonzaga's Foley Center Library and will remain through April 30.

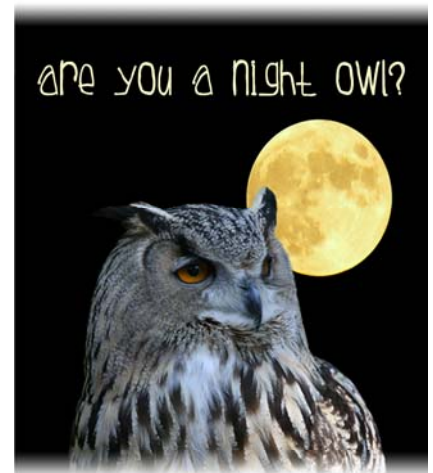
More than 150 items depicting the history of men's and women's basketball at Gonzaga are on

display. The exhibit includes, among other rarely seen Gonzaga athletics memorabilia, rare photographs, Josh Heytvelt's size 18 basketball shoe, trophies, uniforms, news-clippings, tickets, signed basketballs and even the Championship Surfboard from the 2009 Maui Invitational. In addition, visitors will be able to see highlights from the 1959 Gonzaga men's basketball game against Seattle University, which includes footage of former Gonzaga All-American Frank Burgess.

Students asked for the later closing time, and now they have proven they will use it. Up to 200 students are using the Midnight to 2am hours each morning.

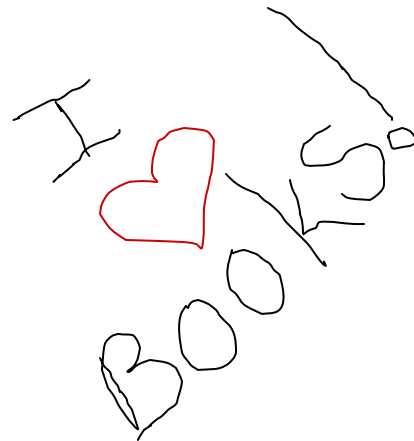
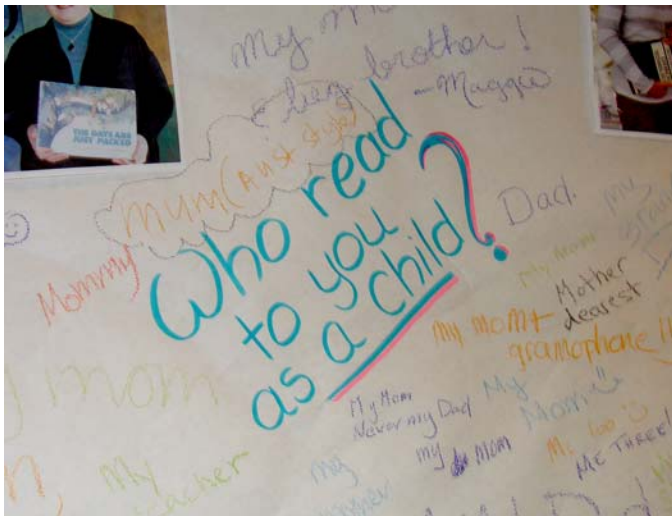

# Read Wall

Questions ranged from “Who read to you as a child?” to “Will paper books ever be a thing of the past?”

Gonzaga University Archivist Stephanie Plowman, who designed the exhibit, said even longtime Zags fans will be surprised to see much of the material on display at the Foley Center exhibit.

“This exhibition displays items that the public normally does not get to see. While the Gonzaga University Archives provided the historical materials, the Athletic Department supplied the current items,” Plowman said. “It is a great opportunity for our two departments to collaborate on this exhibition.”

Because Gonzaga wants as many people as possible to view the exhibit, special Saturday viewing hours have been added, Plowman

said.

“My hope is that the visitors will leave with a much better understanding of – and appreciation for – the development of Gonzaga basketball over the years,” Plowman said. “The relatively recent success of the men’s and women’s teams are the result of a historical foundation that has been in place for years..”

The exhibit will remain open through April 30. Weekday viewing hours are 9 a.m.-noon and 1-4 p.m. The exhibition is open on Saturdays from 1-4 p.m., and is closed on Sundays.

## Tech Update

The seventy research terminals spread throughout Foley Center may look the same as before, but they have had a major overhaul under the hood. The biggest change is their stability. With all new servers supporting them, everything is running better. Many new programs are available on these machines, including Mosaic, Spartan, Notepad ++, SPSS and Wolfram Mathematica. Students are now better able to access these subject specific programs even when the library is open until 2a.m.

The Foley Center Library has always tried to provide some computing access for the non-Gonzaga community, but these machines have not always been the most dependable. With the installa-

tion of four new computers, community users can once again sign in for a 60 minute session of computing.

**New media editing and creation bay** has been installed in lower level of Foley Center. The room may be reserved for three hours. The key checks out at the Circulation desk. The room's Lenovo computer with dual monitors is loaded with the complete Adobe Master Collection CS4, including Photoshop and Premiere.

**Six iMacs** will soon be installed in the lower level of Foley Center. These will have the same capabilities as the research terminals in the building.

**Nine MacBooks** will soon be available for checkout at Circulation . They will circulate for four hours at a time just as the 25 Dell and Lenovo laptops currently do.
