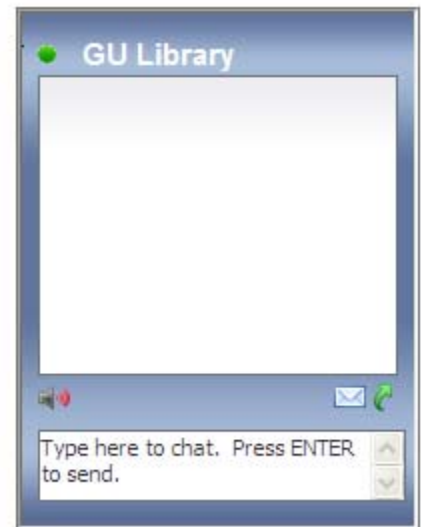

## Chatting & Texting the New Library Norm

Asking a librarian a question or getting help with a research topic is as easy as sending a text message (TM) or instant message (IM). Students and faculty can start chatting or texting with library staff more quickly now that Foley Center Library is using LibraryH3lp, an integrated web chat/IM platform written specifically for libraries.

LibraryH3lp allows Foley librarians to receive chats from a chat widget on the library's home page, as well as IMs from patrons. It is designed to be very mobile-device friendly and also allows users to text the library using a phone number, 509-730-5979. Got a quick question? Text a librarian and they will text you back. This is only available during open library hours. If the library is closed, library users can send

a message or question via LibraryH3lp which will be retrieved once the library reopens. Happy chatting and texting!!

# Bulldog Battalion: Gonzaga's Military Science Marches On

The exhibition "Bulldog Battalion: Gonzaga's Military Science Marches On," is on display through January 31, 2011 in the Cowles Rare Book Room of the Foley Center Library. It showcases Gonzaga University's long military history dating back to 1900.



To showcase this rich and colorful history, the exhibit was developed in collaboration between the Gonzaga University Archives and the Gonzaga Military Science department. The exhibit is open weekdays from 10 am - 4:30 pm, and will be closed November 25-26, 2010, and December 23, 2010, through January 3, 2011.

Photographs, medals, uniforms, patches, scrapbooks, and trophies span the years 1900 to 2010. Highlights of the 160-plus item collection include: a Cadet Corps hat from 1907; Distinguished Flying Cross Medal from World War II; an Army tent showing old and current camping equipment; and Army clothing from the past 60 years. This exhibit and the accompanying catalog were prepared in honor of the Gonzaga All Military Service Reunion held on campus October 22-24, 2010, to recognize Gonzaga alumni who have served in various U.S. Armed Forces over the years.

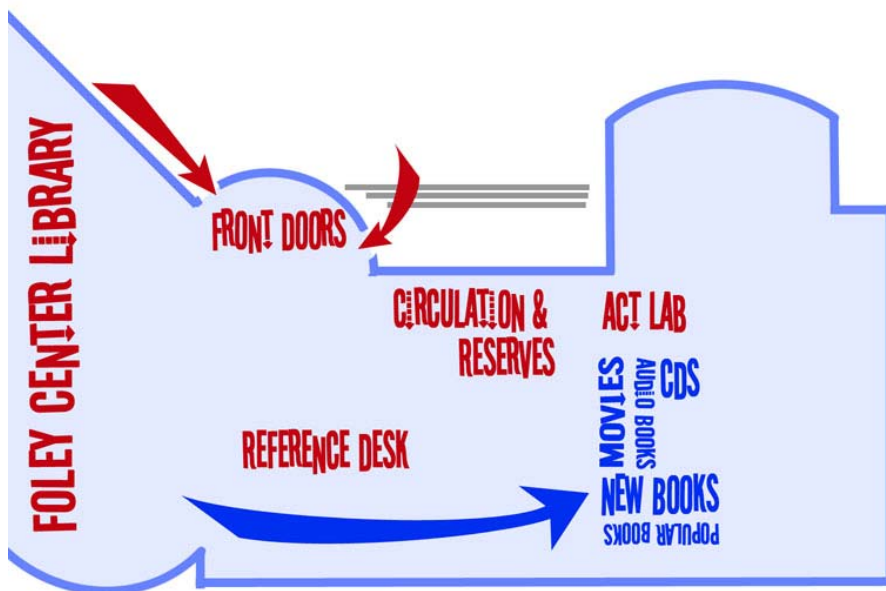
# The Popular Collection has Moved!

Were you looking for something fun to read by the pool this summer but couldn't find Foley Center Library's popular books? Were you looking for an audio book to listen to on a road trip but noticed the audio books are no longer shelved in the same place? Have you wandered around to the back of the Reference Desk in search of your favorite movies, only to find they are no longer there? That's because the Popular Collection has moved!

This summer, we moved things around on the first floor of Foley Library. The Popular Collection, including books, movies, audio books, and CDs, has shifted over to the east side of the first floor, near the ACT Lab. The change allowed us to place six additional computers near the Reference Desk, where the Popular Collection used to be located.

The Popular Book Collection includes fiction and non-fiction titles, best sellers, romance, mystery, and thrillers. The books in this collection are not actually owned by Foley Library. They are leased from the McNaughton Book Company, which provides this service to academic and public libraries across the country. Every month Foley librarians receive a list of upcoming publications that are either predicted to be best sellers or are of popular interest. The librarians then select 10-15 books a month to add to the Popular Collection. Since it is a leased collection it remains at about 300 books at any given time. We also have the opportunity to purchase titles for our permanent collection, if we choose. Because of the small size of the collection these titles have a shorter check out period, in order to allow the books to circulate to more people.

Not only did we move a collection of materials; we also shifted some of our media equipment. The TV/VCR/DVD player combinations that used to be located near the Popular Collection have also moved. Two TV/VCR/DVD players can be found under the stairs on the Lower Level, and one TV/DVD combo is located in a carrel across from the door to the ACT Lab. We also have TVs with DVD players or VCRs in some of our second floor group study rooms. Check at the Circulation Desk for availability of these study aids.



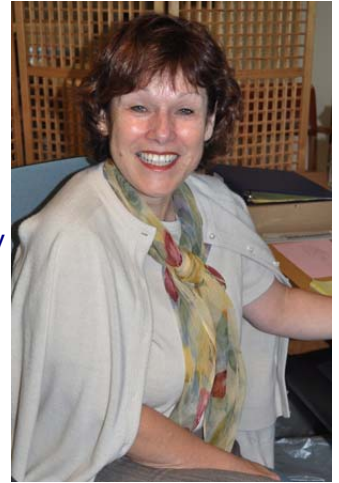

## In Collaboration

Want a place to collaborate with a group (on laptops) in the library?

Students who need to work in a group on a project with multiple laptops would find the MediaScape Collaboration Room ideal for their work. The MediaScape Collaboration Room is located on the lower level of Foley Center Library, just past the Computer Lab, in Room 004. The room provides access to a collaboration tool from Steelcase called MediaScape, which includes two large flat screen monitors and a wired table that up to six people can plug into with laptops or MacBooks. The wired table is connected to the two monitors, and students can project their laptop screens onto the monitors and toggle between multiple screens for easy collaboration.

The MediaScape Room may be used for three-hour blocks of time, and the key must be checked out from the Circulation Desk.

The MediaScape Room is maintained by the staff of the campus IT Help Desk, and questions concerning equipment should be directed to them. The IT Help Desk is located directly across from the MediaScape Room.
