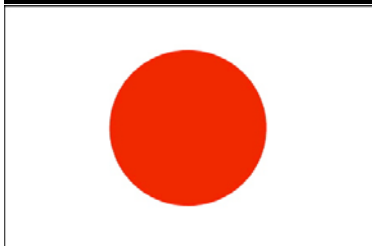

The distinctiveness of the Akita International University (AIU) education begins with the fact that the international campus culture of AIU seeks to selectively blend elements of American universities with those of Japanese universities. Not only is English the main language of instruction but certain features of an American-style university curriculum are being followed with the goal of meeting the highest internationally recognized educational standards.



Akita International University is situated in Akita City, the capital of Akita Prefecture. The campus is set in a lovely rural area surrounded by a forest and a large sports facility across the road. This rich natural setting includes nearby cedar forest, various mountain ranges, the meandering Omono River (one of the largest rivers in Japan), and vibrantly colored rice fields. A distinctive feature of AIU is the view of ancient cherry trees blossoming against the backdrop of snow-capped mountains which can be seen from the campus each spring. AIU is 30-40 minutes by car from the center of Akita City.



As an international student, you will encounter positive, life-changing experiences as you study at Akita International University. There are many opportunities to experience Japanese traditions, to participate in local festivals, and to get to know the people of Akita who take great pride in being Japanese. The beautiful natural environment coupled with the traditional community surrounding AIU provides a wonderful and rich context for you to experience “a real taste of Japan.”

COURSES

LANGUAGE

Courses are taught in English, with the exception of language classes.

HOUSING

Students live in a residence hall on campus with Japanese suitemates. This living experience provides for opportunities to learn more about Japan and its language from the suitemates. You will use English in the classrooms and learn to use Japanese in the residence hall.

PROGRAM COST

Gonzaga University tuition. Student pays housing (which includes 3 meals on weekdays) and fees in Akita (approximately US\$500 per month). Airfare and textbooks are not included.

PASSPORT AND VISAS

All students must have a valid passport to study in Japan and it must be valid three months beyond their stay in Asia. More information will be provided by the Gonzaga University Study Abroad Office.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Fall 2010 / Spring 2011: February 1, 2010

Early application is encouraged. Incomplete applications will not be considered until all documents have been received.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The Akita International Exchange program is open to all undergraduates who have completed sophomore year and two years of Japanese by the time they study abroad. Admission to the program is based on the following criteria:

- ◆ 3.0 GPA
- ◆ Two letters of academic recommendation
- ◆ Clearance forms

4. Two academic recommendations
5. \$50 non-refundable application fee payable to Gonzaga Univ.
6. Completed applications will be accepted at the Study Abroad Office, 323 East Boone Avenue.
