

## PAYMENT OPTIONS

Outlined below are the University's payment options. All payment arrangements are coordinated with the amount and type of verified financial assistance you may receive, excluding workstudy.

Student Accounts accepts cash and checks for payment on account. Electronic payment is also available which includes e-Check at no charge to the student and credit card payment through American Express, MasterCard and Discover, with a convenience fee. ### Payment in Full (one semester)

- Deadline for fall semester – August 5, 2011.
- Deadline for spring semester – January 3, 2012.

### 10-Month Note (academic year)

The estimated total cost for fall and spring semesters, less verified financial aid, can be set up in ten equal monthly installments.

- Interest-free.
- Lower payments.
- Application and \$65 fee must be received in the Student Accounts Office by June 1, 2011.
- Payments are due the first of each month beginning July 1, 2011.

### 8-Month Note (academic year)

The estimated total cost for fall and spring semesters, less verified financial aid, can be set up in eight equal monthly installments.

- Interest-free.
- Application and \$100 fee must be received in the Student Accounts Office by August 1, 2011. (Applications not received by August 1, will result in a \$150 application fee.)
- Payments are due the first of each month beginning September 1, 2011.

Students accepted after installment plan deadline dates may still apply within two weeks of their acceptance, making up any missed payments and will not be charged the late application fee.

## DECEMBER GRADUATES OR SPRING-ONLY STUDENTS

The estimated total cost for one semester, less verified financial aid, can be set up in four or five equal monthly installments. (Applications submitted after the deadline dates are subject to an additional \$25 fee.)

### 5-Month Note

- Interest-free.
- Application and \$32.50 fee must be received in Student Accounts by June 1, 2011, for December graduates or by November 1, 2011, for spring-only students.
- Payments are due the first of each month beginning July 1, 2011, for December graduates or by December 1, 2011, for spring-only students.

### 4-Month Note

- Interest-free.
- Application and \$50 fee must be received in Student Accounts by August 1, 2011, for December graduates or by December 1, 2011, for spring-only students.
- Payments are due the first of each month beginning September 1, 2011, for December graduates or by January 1, 2012, for spring-only students.

### Third Party Sponsors

If your student account balance is to be paid by a corporate or foreign sponsor, a government agency, a religious institution, a scholarship foundation or trust account, we require written proof of sponsorship from that agency in the Student Accounts Office to settle your account.

- Deadline for fall semester – August 5, 2011.
- Deadline for spring semester – January 3, 2012.

## INSURANCE

**International Students:** For visa reasons, the International Student Programs Office requires that international students purchase the University-sponsored Student Injury and Sickness Insurance Plan. If you have any questions, please contact Gonzaga's International Student Programs Office at (509) 313-6563.

**All Other Students:** The University-sponsored Accident Insurance coverage is mandatory. ## ADJUSTMENTS FOR DROPPED COURSES

Full-time undergraduates taking 12-18 credits are charged a flat rate. Undergraduates who drop classes\* but still remain full-time students receive no tuition adjustment. Refunds on lab fees are given through the first full week of classes.

Students, including graduate level students, who are charged by the credit hour, may be eligible for tuition adjustments for dropped courses. After classes commence, tuition adjustments for dropped courses will be computed as follows: during the first full week of classes – 100%; during the second full week of classes – 80%; during the third full week of classes – 60%; during the fourth full week of classes – 40%. No refund will be made after the fourth full week of the semester.

\* Please remember that for financial aid purposes, a full-time undergraduate student must be registered for 12+ credit hours. Financial aid awards may be adjusted if you drop below 12 credits.

## COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY

Students completely withdrawing will obtain a withdrawal form and be interviewed by the Academic Services Office. Tuition adjustments are calculated in Student Accounts. Final adjustments are based on the effective dates of complete withdrawals.\* Room and board will be prorated throughout the semester. Financial aid funds will be refunded in accordance with governmental and University regulations.

\* The tuition adjustment schedule for complete withdrawals is posted in the Student Accounts and Financial Aid offices.

The University reserves the right to change any costs and/or provisions without notice. It further reserves the right to withhold student information, including transcripts of record and diplomas, until said student's account has been paid in full. No student will be allowed to register for an ensuing semester if a balance is owed for a prior semester.

A finance charge of 12% per annum pro rata (365 days) or a rebilling fee of 1% of the total amount due or \$2, whichever is greater, will be added to a student's account on any amount more than thirty days past due.

### Meal Plans (per semester):

Food services to the University students are provided by Sodexo Dining Services. The University facilitates those arrangements by billing, collecting and remitting charges for those services. Six meal plans are offered:

**Diamond**..... \$ 2,090  
Unlimited access to the resident dining facility, all hours, plus \$300 in dining dollars for purchases at any campus retail location.

**Sapphire**..... \$ 1,990  
Unlimited access to the resident dining facility, 10:45 am to 7:30 pm, weekend brunch and dinners, plus \$400 in dining dollars for purchases at any campus retail location.

**Ruby**..... \$ 1,965  
Unlimited access to the resident dining facility, 7:00 am to 2:00 pm, weekend brunch, plus \$400 in dining dollars for purchases at any campus retail location.

**Block A**..... \$ 1,940  
150 block meals at the resident dining facility, all hours, plus \$400 in dining dollars for purchases at any campus retail location.

**Block B**..... \$ 1,930  
120 block meals at the resident dining facility, all hours, plus \$600 in dining dollars for purchases at any campus retail location.

**Block C**..... \$ 1,385  
*Non-mandatory students only*, 95 block meals at the resident dining facility, all hours, plus \$610 in dining dollars for purchases at any campus retail location.

## BOOKS AND SUPPLIES

The cost of books and supplies will vary depending on your major and class schedule. An estimated, per semester cost for full-time undergraduate students is \$500. (Used books may be available at substantial savings.)
