Gonzaga University will test the ZagAlert emergency notification system

Thursday, February 14, 2019

During the drill, the University will send one ZagAlert message, which will clearly be marked as a 'test' message. You will not need to take any kind of protective action.

You may receive the message on multiple platforms, including: email, text, voicemail, or recorded phone call. These messages can arrive to any email or any telephone number provided by you. You may also hear an announcement if you are outdoors.

Text and email messages will include a link to a feedback survey, which will also be advertised on the website, social media sites, and via morning mail. Please take a few moments to answer important questions about the ZagAlert drill.

You can verify your information in the ZagAlert system by visiting ZagWeb and selecting the "ZagAlert" tab in your profile. We also encourage all members of the Gonzaga community to download and register the MyConnect app on their mobile devices.
