GU Pre-service Teacher Certification Program Under Revision

Washington State mandated changes from a candidate performance to a K-12 student learning evidence based system of preparing future teachers. In response, the SOE has charged an executive development team with revising Gonzaga programs preparing beginning teachers. The redesigned program must emphasize: K-12 student voice; sustainability education; assessment; integrated literacy, math and science in all subjects taught; and partnerships involving increased collaboration between higher education and K-12 schools. The redesigned program must be ready for implementation in the Fall of 2009.
