

Application Instructions

Visiting Student Application and Admissions Information

Gonzaga School of Law may admit visiting students who are currently enrolled in a law school and plan to transfer credits back to their home law school for graduation. Most visiting students are enrolled in ABA-accredited law schools. It is your responsibility to confirm that credits received at Gonzaga will transfer back to your home school and will be applied to your law degree.

We require applicants to submit:

- A cover letter, addressed to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at Gonzaga Law, stating the reason(s) you would like to visit Gonzaga School of Law
- A completed application
- A letter of good standing from the Dean or Associate Dean (preferably an academic Dean) of your home law school
 giving you permission to visit Gonzaga. This letter should include: the semester(s) you are allowed to attend Gonzaga
 School of Law, the number of credits you can take while at Gonzaga, which courses you are approved to take, and the
 grade you must receive in order for the credits to transfer back to your home school.
- A complete and official transcript of law courses from your home law school.

FAFSA

To apply for financial aid, visit http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/ and complete the US Department of Education Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). We strongly recommend filing a FAFSA as soon after January 1 as possible, and preferably no later than February 1.

International Applicants

The School of Law requires that your foreign transcripts be submitted through the LSAC Credential Assembly Service. If you completed any postsecondary work outside the US (including its territories) or Canada, you must use this service for the evaluation and authentication of your foreign transcripts. The one exception to this requirement is if you completed the foreign work through a study abroad, consortium, or exchange program sponsored by a US or Canadian institution, and the work is clearly indicated as such on the home campus transcript. This service is included in the Credential Assembly Service registration fee. An International Credential Evaluation will be completed by the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO), which will be incorporated into your law school report. You will need to submit a TOEFL score, with minimum score of 600, for your application to be complete. You must contact the Educational Testing Service (ETS) and request that your TOEFL score be sent to LSAC. LSAC's TOEFL code for the Credential Assembly Service is 8395. Your score will be included in the International Credential Evaluation document that will be included in your law school report.

To use the Credential Assembly Service, log in to your online account and follow the instructions for registering for the service. Be sure to print out a Transcript Request Form for each institution and send it promptly to them. More time is usually required to receive foreign transcripts.
