Club Conduct Process

Report/complaint about club/student organization is received by the university.*

If the complaint is a minor infraction, or procedural, it will be shared with the Center for Student Involvement staff to address and work with group.

CSI will resolve action plan with group directly.

If the complaint is a larger infraction (e.g., Title IX, hazing, alcohol/drugs, systemic issues, etc.), the complaint is sent to the Office of Community Standards for an investigation.

Upon the completion of the investigation, the Office of Community Standards will send the report/findings to the Assistant Dean of Student Involvment and Leadership for a decision.

If the club would like to appeal the decision made by the CSI staff, they will appeal to the Assistant Dean, Student Involvement and Leadership.

The Assistant Dean for Student Involvement and Leadership will review the report. (In some situations they may consult the club leadership or other students/faculty/staff for additional information.)

The Assistant Dean will decide the outcome of the conduct case. The club leadership, advisor and Dean of Students wil receive a copy of the outcome letter.

*These are the types of questions we ask when determining if this is an individual or a club violation:

- Does the incident report/original communication about the incident name the club?
- For the parties involved in the incident, is the club a common denominator?
- O Did the event happen at a club event? Or an event associated with the official club event (pre or post)?
- Were there more than 2 club officers present at the event?
- Was the conduct in relation to, or a product of, a club function, or mission?
- o Was there hazing for the club involved?
- Was the event/conduct documented on the club social media or website?
- O Does it seem like the event is associated with the club?

If the club would like to appeal the decision made by the Assistant Dean of Students, they will appeal to the Vice President for Student Development.
